GOD USES LITTLE PEOPLE

In our world today everyone seems to think that you have to be the president of a company, rich, or at the top somehow to make a difference, but I want to tell you how God has used 'little people' in a massive way!



In August of 2006 God laid on my heart a project to assist and help the hospital of La Esperanza Honduras. I am nobody, just a nurse in a hospital that makes it week to week. Because of the desire HE placed in my heart I started looking for ways to help these people and their circumstances. I met several people that had the desire to do the same and we united to make a difference. Through this desire and these efforts people donated \$20, \$100, \$200, and \$500. Not hundreds of thousands of dollars. Not rich people, CEO's, big businesses, etc. just ordinary everyday people like you and me. And our church donated \$2,000 for

shipping.

Through all of their efforts we were able to take the donated medical equipment and supplies, purchase more, and fill a 45ft container, ship it to Honduras, and bless the hospital with it. I want to thank everyone who prayed for us, donated time, money, supplies, equipment, storage, and physical labor. This was not an individual project nor was it a big people project and yet it will bless an entire region of people.

The project has just begun and there is much more to do and I can't wait to see what God has in store and who HE uses to get it done!



Receiving the truck at the hospital was very exciting and interesting! We loaded the container in 15 minutes in the states, thanks to a very nice forklift driver. I know things are different in Honduras, but had no idea to be prepared for this: the container was in port for 5-6 days getting cleared to be brought to us, then it arrived at 7:30pm and after an hour and a half of attempting to get to the hospital building the truck driver decided he couldn't make it. So our journey began.



In the dark and pouring rain some very dedicated people unloaded the 45 ft container into the back of pickup trucks and then drove it to the hospital building and we formed lines and unloaded from the trucks to the building. Five hours later we filled the building and then some. GOD is SO

AWESOME!!!!

Did I mention we got just a little WET? It was a tremendous experience and it was truly a blessing to see people that had nothing to gain, except heavenly rewards, work so hard and then to see how blessed the hospital personnel were!



This is the roof that was completed over the Operating Room of the hospital (they can actually use their operating room without water leaking on the patient or table now!) Thank you God for giving people the heart, resources, and ability to get this portion of the roof done! There has been another portion started over the labor & deliver unit and pediatric unit. The patients are breathing in mold and leaks are everywhere, on top of them already being sick. Please pray for the rest of the roof and the inside ceiling to be provided!



On a personal note: Haley, our 16 year old, made a decision to follow Christ and was baptized. We are preparing to move to Honduras full-time in August for a one year commitment, where we will be working with the hospital, medical teams, and assist Mercy International with making a difference to the Honduran people, spreading the gospel, and most of all spreading Gods love!



We are planning to rent a house in Yamaranguila Honduras and attend language school as well. Lots to do! Please continue to pray for us and thank you all so much!

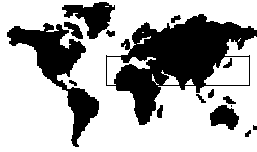

Dear Dean and Melissa,

I am happy to inform you that you have been accepted as intern-staff with Mercy International in Honduras. I appreciate your willingness to serve and that you have been faithful to fulfill all requests to the best of your ability made by myself and Pastor Steve Dixon. The designation intern-staff is customary for first-year staff with little or no experience serving in foreign missions.

We anticipate that you will spend up to three months studying Spanish at the language school of your choice as soon as possible. Then you will be asked to serve in a limited capacity in the following areas until your Spanish proficiency allows you to begin work more in depth.

Dean, you are expected to serve as technical advisor in our offices until your Spanish proficiency allows you to begin assisting local schools in their computer labs and as an instructor of *Information Technology*. You will also be asked to assume a role in ongoing ministries especially providing logistics and assistance for team ministries.

Melissa is expected to work a minimum three days a week at the local hospital in La Esperanza serving as an assistant to the charge nurse in the labor and delivery ward.

Your expected arrival date is August 14, 2007. The term of your service is to be discussed.

Thank you for your desire to serve in Honduras. We look forward with anticipation your arrival.
